## MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



This month's feature car is Russell Kuhn's black 1999 Mustang GT. His car is black with black leather interior. The 4.6L engine is backed with a 5 speed transmission. In the six years he has owned the car, Russell has added a long list of modifications to the car including a Kenne Bell supercharger (11 PSI), NOS nitrous system, CNC ported cylinder heads, larger camshafts, long tube headers, off road "H" pipe, Magnaflo catback exhaust, Autometer gauges, Kaenen double cowl hood, MGW shifter, Pioneer Stereo, Kenwood amp & speakers, American Muscle '03 cobra replica 10.5 inch rear wheels, 9 inch fronts. All of the work including most of the tuning, with the exception of painting the hood, was done by Russell. The car now spins the dyno rollers at 450

RWHP, not including the 50 HP shot of nitrous. Russell learned just before Christmas in 2004 that a modified Mustang is the worst car to have in the snow. He drove the car to work the last day before the Christmas shut down. Shortly after he goes to work it started snowing. By the time he could leave work there was a foot of snow on the ground. He lived in Madison at the time and the 40 mile drive took three hours to get home. He managed to keep the car on the road until he could not make it up a small hill in front of his house. He decided to park the car at a neighbor's shop across the road where it did finally slide off into the ditch. At that point he gave up and walked home. It sat in the ditch for two days until his neighbor pulled it out of the ditch with his tractor and dragged it all the way to his house.
